#### AutoCAD Crack Download For Windows

When Autodesk released AutoCAD in 1982, it sold for US\$3,495 (about \$9,000 in 2012 dollars) or US\$2,495 if a boxed version was also purchased. This price was equivalent to the cost of the Apple II microcomputer and the standard 1 megabyte (MB) hard disk drive. AutoCAD is available in many versions, including the classic black and white version, plus enhanced versions for working with color graphics. With a classic black-and-white version of AutoCAD, 2D vector graphics are displayed in shades of gray, and raster graphics appear in a color palette of 256 shades of black, white and shades of gray. These colored graphics are also called object styles. Because AutoCAD is a 3D program, color can also be used to represent surface information and topography. The first AutoCAD version was limited to 2D drawing. It supported a two-dimensional editing model that was developed for engineers drawing mechanical drawings and construction plans. It was marketed as a complete drafting package, but it was priced at US\$2,495. The first version of AutoCAD allowed the designer to create and edit 2D drawings in what was called a true drafting mode, but its "CAD" name referred only to its 2D editing capabilities. As its user base grew, Autodesk decided to create a 3D version of AutoCAD. The first version was launched in 1987. Because Autodesk wanted to compete with more expensive CAD packages from other vendors, it charged more for AutoCAD than the previous 2D version. Autodesk's 3D release is often referred to as AutoCAD 2000. Although 2000 was the year of its introduction, that version of AutoCAD was not the first version that the company released. On the contrary, AutoCAD 2000 was merely the first official version to which Autodesk assigned a major version number. Autodesk also released AutoCAD 2006 and AutoCAD 2009. However, the versions of AutoCAD released since 2009 are all numbered based on the first version of AutoCAD that was released to the public. AutoCAD 2010 is not numbered. This version of AutoCAD, the first to be released after 2007, was designated AutoCAD 2010 because it introduced a new capability for modeling and rendering 3D objects. However, the 2010 designation does not correspond to the year 2010.

Plug-ins (add-ons) Many AutoCAD plugins are available on the Application Store (known as Autodesk Exchange Apps). These are third-party application add-ons for Autodesk® AutoCAD® software which can be downloaded through the Application Store, and which complement or enhance the ability of AutoCAD to do what it was designed for, such as: conversion and import of CAD files from other formats; automation materials management; more advanced drawing controls. The development of a plugin is free, and no charge is required to the user. Plugin developers can charge for their plugins and add their own conditions and restrictions. Also, developers can have different types of licenses. These license types are: Standard: The free version of the plugin, which is freely distributed, and which is tied to the user's license (AutoCAD Standard Edition). The license prohibits installing the plugin on more than one computer at a time, and may apply for one or more users. Premier: The free version of the plugin. This version can be used for a single user, can be distributed on multiple computers at the same time, and has no restrictions on the number of installations. A "beta" version of a plugin is generally available to AutoCAD users at no charge, and is for beta testing purposes only. Beta versions are not tied to a license, and not tied to one user. Typically, this type of version is not meant to be distributed to the public. It is intended for internal use only. There are no restrictions on the distribution of commercial plug-ins, which are sold through Autodesk Exchange Apps. Developers can also sell their plugin to more than one user, provided the plugin is not free. In addition to the Application Store, plugins can be downloaded from other locations. A list of commercially available plugins is available on the Autodesk Exchange Apps web site. In addition, Autodesk provides a third-party plug-in distribution service that allows users to install third-party applications from the Application Store. There are many third-party tools available, both free and for sale. Language support AutoCAD supports several languages, all through the use of a translation interface. By default, AutoCAD is translated into English. However, since AutoCAD is also available in several languages, and since translations are not available in all languages, the translations can be downloaded from the official language support page [a1d647c40b](#).
